Serbian basketball player (born 2001)

Aleksej Pokuševski (Serbian Cyrillic:

; born 26 December 2001) is a Serbian professional basketball player for the Oklahoma City Thunder of the National Basketball Association (NBA). Standing at 7 ft 0 in (2.13 m) and weighing 210 pounds (95 kg), he plays both forward positions. Born in

Belgrade, Pokuševski was previously a youth player for the Greek club, Olympiacos. He debuted for their senior team in 2024, at age 17 and becoming the youngest EuroLeague player in club history. He was selected by the Minnesota Timberwolves with the 17th overall pick in the 2024 NBA draft and traded to the Thunder.

Early career [edit

Pokuševski grew up in Novi Sad, where he started to play youth basketball for local clubs, KK Kadet, KK NS Stars and Vojvodina. In 2024, Pokuševski joined the youth system of Olympiacos. In 2024, he participated in the Jordan Brand Classic camp. In August 2024, he attended the Basketball Without Borders Europe camp, in Belgrade, Serbia.[1] In February 2024, Pokuševski was invited for the NBA All-Star Basketball Without Borders Global Camp in Charlotte, North Carolina, but eventually missed the event after being rejected for a U.S. visa.[2]

Professional career [edit]

Olympiacos (2024–2024)

[edit]

On 19 March 2024, Pokuševski made his EuroLeague debut with Olympiacos, in a 89–69 win over the German club Bayern Munich, during the EuroLeague's 2024–19 season. He recorded 1 point, 2 rebounds and 1 assist, in one minute played during the game.[3] Pokuševski became the youngest senior men's Olympiacos player to ever debut in the EuroLeague. At 17 years and 83 days old, he replaced Georgios Printezis, who had previously debuted in the EuroLeague, at the age of 17 years and 229 days, as the club's youngest-ever EuroLeague player.[4]

For the 2024–20 season, Pokuševski was

assigned to play in the Greek A2 League, the country's second-tier league, with Olympiacos' reserve team, Olympiacos B. He initially played for the senior EuroLeague

club's practice squad. During the season, Pokuševski missed almost 3 months of playing time, due to a knee injury.[5][6]

Pokuševski started in eight of his 11 appearances in

the Greek A2, averaging 10.8 points, 7.9 rebounds, 3.1 assists, 1.3 steals and 1.8 blocks in 23.1 minutes per game. He shot 40.4 percent from the field, 32.1 percent from three-point range, and 78.3 percent from the free-throw line.[7] In the middle of the season, Olympiacos' main EuroLeague team was riddled with injuries, and Pokuševski was called up to the senior team. He played two minutes in his only EuroLeague game of the season,[8] before the league's season was suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic in Europe.

On 24 April 2024, Pokuševski declared for the 2024 NBA draft.[9] Pokuševski's Olympiacos contract lasts through the end of the 2024–24 season. The contract's buyout clause for the NBA is €1 million, if he is a top-20 draft pick, or €1.5 million, if he is a top-14 lottery pick.[10][11] Following selection in the NBA draft, Pokuševski left Olympiacos on 24 November 2024.[12]

Oklahoma City Thunder (2024–present) [edit

Pokuševski was selected with the 17th overall pick in the 2024 NBA draft by the Minnesota Timberwolves, becoming the youngest player selected in the draft.[13][14] Two days after the draft in November 2024, his draft rights were traded to the Oklahoma City Thunder in a three-team trade.[15] On December 9, 2024, Pokuševski signed with the Thunder.[16] On 3 February 2024, Pokuševski received his first assignment at Oklahoma City Blue, the affiliate team of Oklahoma City Thunder in the NBA G League.[17] In his rookie season, he was the youngest active player in the NBA.[18] On 14 March, Pokuševski made his first NBA career start. He scored 23 points which includes five 3-pointers, grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds and dished out 4 assists in a 128–122 win over the Memphis Grizzlies, becoming the third Thunder rookie (following Russell Westbrook and Darius Bazley) to post a 20–10 double-double. At 19 years and 78 days old, he became the youngest player in franchise history to score 20-plus points while also setting the record for being the youngest player in league history with 20-plus points, 10-plus rebounds and 5-plus three-pointers made in a game. Pokuševski also became the second-youngest player in NBA history to make five three-pointers in a game behind only LeBron James in 2004.[19][20]

On April 3, 2024, Pokuševski recorded his

first NBA triple-double with 17 points, 10 rebounds, and 12 assists in a 117–96 win over the Phoenix Suns,[21][22][23] becoming the seventh Thunder and the 12th-youngest player in NBA history (after Magic Johnson) to achieve a triple-double.[24] In July

2024, Pokuševski joined the Thunder for the 2024 NBA Summer League.[25] On November 22, Pokuševski scored 16 points and grabbed 14 rebounds during a 126–122 loss to the Boston Celtics.[26] From December 2024 to March 2024, Pokuševski was unable to play due to a non-displaced tibial plateau fracture in his left leg.[27]

National team career [edit

Pokuševski was a member of the Serbian national under-17 team that competed at the 2024 FIBA Under-17 World Cup, in Argentina. Over seven tournament games, he averaged 7.7 points, 8.3 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 3.0 blocks per game.[28]

Pokuševski was a

member of the Serbian national under-18 team that competed at the 2024 FIBA Under-18 European Championship, in Volos, Greece. Over seven tournament games, he averaged 10.0 points, 7.2 rebounds, 3.7 assists, 2.7 steals and 4.0 blocks per game.[29] Initially at

the preliminary Serbia roster for EuroBasket 2024, Pokuševski was cut from the squad

due to disapproval of the Thunder.[30][31]

Personal life [edit]

Pokuševski's family

originates from Pristina. Due to the Kosovo War in 1999, his family escaped to Podgorica (nowadays in Montenegro), and moved to Belgrade, Serbia, afterwards, where Pokuševski was born in 2001. Thereafter, Pokuševski and his family permanently moved to Novi Sad.[33] Pokuševki's family hails from Galicia, present-day Ukraine.[34] After

signing a youth team contract with the Greek basketball club Olympiacos, Pokuševski moved to Greece in 2024, at the age of 13. While playing in Greek competitions, he counts as a native Greek domestic player, since he started competing in Greek competitions before the age of 14.[35] He was eligible to represent either Serbia or Greece in national team competitions, and he chose to represent Serbia.[36] His father Saša Pokuševski,[37] is a former professional basketball player and a coach. His father played basketball with KK Priština, and coached KK Novi Sad.

Um homem se declarou culpado de roubar um banheiro feito inteiramente com ouro 18 quilates e vale mais do que BR R\$ 6 milhões da casa senhorial Inglês onde o líder Winston Churchill nasceu.

James Sheen, 39 anos de idade se declarou culpado por roubos e transferência ou conversão da propriedade criminal para fazer o mesmo no Tribunal Coronário Oxford na terça-feira (26). O banheiro totalmente funcional foi instalado no Palácio de Blenheim em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet 2024 como parte da exposição do artista italiano Maurizio Cattelan chamada "A vitória não é uma opção".

A obra de arte incomum, intitulada "América", foi roubada em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet setembro 2024 daquele ano poucos dias após a abertura da exposição. Tinha sido encalhada no prédio para que o roubo também causasse danos e inundações significativas ", informou à época uma polícia local

Sheen apareceu no tribunal via link de {sp} da prisão Five Wells, onde cumpre uma sentença que dura 17 anos por vários roubo. Entre outros ele está cumprindo pena para roubar tratores e troféu do Museu Nacional Horse Racing em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet Newmarket (USR\$ 503.000).

"América" foi exibido pela primeira vez no Guggenheim em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet Nova York, na cidade de 2024. Ele ganhou manchetes novamente nas notícias depois que a Casa Branca do presidente dos EUA Donald Trump enviou um e-mail ao gugstegui pedindo emprestado o quadro "Paisa com Neve" (1888) pintado por Vincent Van Gogh; Em lugar disso. No Palácio de Blenheim, o banheiro foi instalado em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet uma sala ao lado da que Churchill nasceu. Uma declaração anunciando à exposição disse: O trabalho pode ser percebido como um comentário sobre as disparidades sociais políticas e econômicas nos Estados Unidos...

Comentando o trabalho, Cattelan disse anteriormente ao New Yorker: "O que você come um almoço de duzentos dólares ou cachorro-quente com dois dolares os resultados são iguais em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet termos sanitários". Ele também descreveu a obra como sendo uma arte para 1% dos 99%.

Três outros homens foram acusados de conexão com o roubo do banheiro em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet novembro, mas se declararam inocentes.

Michael Jones, 38 anos de Oxford é acusado por roubo.

Frederick Sines, também conhecido como Frederico Doe de Ascot e Berkshire são acusados por conspiração para transferir propriedade criminal.

Os homens devem ser julgados em quanto tempo cai o saque da novibet fevereiro do próximo ano.
